Continuing our studies on Psalm 23.

In biblical days a shepherd would need to move his flock on to new pastures. However, before he did that he would spend time checking out the pasture for possible dangers and risks.

Some of those risks might involve toxic weeds and grasses. Some years ago I was visiting a farm and I was invited to take a tour of the property with the owner. We entered a paddock

with a large number of sheep, and as we got close to the animals we noticed several were falling and stumbling. It was like they had been drinking too many beers. The owner explained the problem was Rye Grass toxicity. The excessive gas given off from the lush Rye Grass caused the inebriated symptoms.

Also the shepherd would have been keenly looking for the presence of viper snakes. They lived in holes in the ground, and once found the shepherd would take a bottle of oil from his belt and pour oil in and around the hole. This slippery environment hindered the snake's movement around its hole. So in a literal sense the shepherd was preparing a table for his sheep in the presence of their enemy.

I experienced this on a recent trip. I was aware of God's protection and of His direction to prepared contacts. The sheep were able to go about their lives in peace and enjoy safe surroundings. In the same way I was able to go about promoting Challenge with the care, provision and protection of God. It is wonderful to know that when God has sent us on a mission, that He has gone before us in every situation and circumstance that may arise. It is only as we rest in Jesus, our divine shepherd, and have confidence in His care and thus experience His presence, that the Christian life becomes a walk of calmness and quiet confidence.

We need to see another aspect of this verse. Oil is a picture of the Holy Spirit and His power.

One of the common problems that a shepherd had to deal with was the sheep being tormented by Nasal Fly. They had the rather unpleasant habit of laying eggs in the nasal passages of sheep. Once hatched the maggots would feed on the sheep's delicate nasal tissue. A shepherd would know that he had a problem because a sheep infected with maggots would become irritated and distressed. To solve the problem the shepherd would use a mix of linseed oil, sulphur and tar. Once applied

the oil treatment would bring about an almost instant transformation in the sheep's behaviour.

We as Christians can sometimes have a problem with being irritated, impatient and critical, perhaps even subject to fits of anger. But once we allow the Holy Spirit to fill us He brings about a transformation in our behaviour and attitudes.
